Programme Outcome:

Literature also acts as a Catharsis. It helps us to outpour our pent-up emotions (v) which we generally hide in our deep heart.

Reading can make one feel more empathetic. Literature has a particularly powerful effect on human emotion and mind. It forces the reader to put themselves in other people's situation.

Literature offers a unique way to engage with history in a more interesting (vii) manner.

Literature improves student's ability to write, which helps them to become a better communicator. It also helps to enhance a person's writing skills. It also improves students' vocabulary and relieves stress and anxiety.

Literature also helps to improve our power of Cognition (reflecting and applying (ix) things having read), Reasoning (drawing conclusions from requirements already given) and Creative Thinking (finding solution by means of Knowledge, principles and ideas).

Course Outcome:

The learning outcome for B.A. in the subject English is designed to help learners analyze, appreciate, understand and critically engage with literary text written in English. The programmes are devoted to classroom learning, group and individual learning and library and field research projects. The key component in the programme is developing the ability to communicate at different levels, ranging from basis to critical communication. Students become familiar with representative literary and cultural texts within a significant number of historical, geographical and cultural contexts.
